Village Events

Christmas Lights

The annual light switch-on was again a positive event with the community pulling together to make it happen. Plans and discussions are already happening in preparation for Dec 2017 and it is hoped to build on the successes of previous years.

Village Clean-up

A large number of people turned out to help tidy the village and over the 2 days a huge quantity of rubbish – ranging from discarded CDs to a bath tub and car tyres to a gas fire were collected and ultimately removed by Bassetlaw District Council. They were immensely grateful to the residents of Elkesley for their efforts and the difference was quite noticeable. It is a shame to see the litter thrown and another day is being considered for the autumn.

The Robin Hood Inn

After some battling and to-ing and fro-ing, the pub retained its status as an asset of community value following an appeal hearing by a judge from London. In the months after this, the planning application to demolish the pub and construct a significant number of dwellings was retracted and the site is as it was. Various people have expressed an interest in re-opening the pub but at the present time the ownership has not changed.

Garages

Contact has been made with Bassetlaw with a view to potentially taking over the management of the garages in the village. We have not heard anything yet but will keep people informed

Allotments

The Parish Council has been approached regarding allotments and we are looking at what can be done. We need as many letters of interest for this to be progressed

Defib

The funding for a 2nd defib has been in place for some time. It has now been ordered and should be installed in the very near future. Many communities have a defib, for a village of our size to have 2 is fantastic

BMX

A grant application has been submitted to construct a junior BMX track adjacent to the existing one and will provide another opportunity for people to enjoy. Providing we are successful this will include benches and a covered seating area as well as good access for all from the park.

Councillors

It is good to see that we again have a full complement of Parish Councillors. The various roles that the Council undertakes have been shared out and will hopefully enable us to provide a more efficient operation

As I have just indicated, last year was extremely busy for us all and I would like to thank the people sat around this table as well as everyone else who has got involved in lending their support to assist with the various activities and projects. It's through the goodwill of people that Elkesley can achieve so much.
